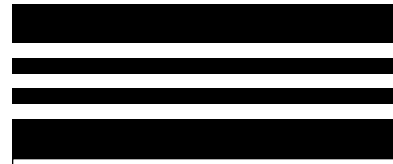

Apply for an Engineer-In-Training or Land Surveyor-In-Training certification in Washington State.

Engineer-In-Training (EIT) - Certification is available to those who submit an application showing they meet the requirements listed in WAC 196-20-007 and have passed the Fundamentals of Engineering (FE).

Land Surveyor-In-Training (LSIT) - Certification is available to those who submit an application showing they meet the requirements listed in WAC 196-21 and have passed the Fundamentals of Surveying (FS).

*You are not required to have a Social Security Number (SSN) or Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN or TIN) to apply for or be issued a license. If you do not have an SSN or ITIN, leave that section blank. If you do have a SSN, ITIN or TIN, you are required by federal and state law to provide it on the application (42 U.S.C. 666(a)(13) and RCW 74.20A.320).
